


## EYFS:

## Year 1 and 2:



Our curriculum project this half term is 'Marvellous Medicine. This half term we will be looking at Florence Nightingale and how hospitals have changed over time. We will be fortunate enough to have a visit from some real medical experts to help us deepen our learning. As part of our Science this half term we will be looking at the human body and how we can keep ourselves healthy. This links well with our DT topic where we are going to be designing and tasting a healthy watermelon pizza. We couldn't let a topic called Marvellous Medicine take place without reading the famous story by Roald Dhal.. I wonder if George's medicinal creations would make it into a pharmacy today?!

English The children will continue to access a range of reading and writing opportunities during their Read, Write Inc. phonics lessons. We will send home links to the Read Write inc. virtual classroom videos. Please watch these with your child to help reinforce their phonics learning at home. This half term we will continue to focus on the fundamentals of being a successful writer. Therefore, we are going to look closely at our letter formation, use of capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. When reading our class book 'George's marvellous medicine' we will explore the descriptive language that Roald Dhal has used to conjure up his gruesome images!	<ul> <li>Maths</li> <li>Children will develop their skills and concept of: <ul> <li>place value (within 100)</li> <li>estimating on a number line</li> <li>comparing and ordering objects and numbers</li> <li>exploring properties of 2D and 3D shapes</li> </ul> </li> <li>There will not be a weekly Maths homework task in KS1. However, please continue to work on quick recall of number bonds to 10 and then 20. E.g. 1+9 = 10, 2 + 8 = 10, 3 + 7 = 10 etc. We will be using an online game called 'hit the button' on Topmarks, this is a website that you can also access at home on a laptop or tablet. Please also continue to work on the quick recall of doubles up to 10.</li> </ul>
Spellings: The Year 1 and 2 common exception words were sent home at parents evening. Please continue to practice reading and writing these.

<b>History</b> We will be exploring the life of Florence Nightingale and understand the impact she had on Victorian nursing and nursing today. We will compare hospitals in the past to modern hospitals. We will also be having a visit from some real life superheroes who help to keep us healthy!	<ul> <li>DT</li> <li>We are going to be designing and creating a healthy watermelon pizza. <b>PE</b> This term we are going to be focusing on Dance. We will be looking at a range of movements and how we can put these together in a sequence. We will be trying to tell a story with our bodies and move in time to the music.	<b>Computing</b> This term our unit is Digital Media. We will be using the tools on Paint to create an image in the style of Henri Matisse. The children will compare their digital image to a paper image.
MusicWe will be exploring tempo this half term with a piece of music called The Snail and the Mouse. We will be exploring fast and slow rhythms and creating a beat with different instruments. The children will demonstrate fast and slow beats within the context of a story.Expect to hear lots of Christmas singing! We will be practising our songs ready for our performance at the end of the term.	<ul> <li>PE this term is on Thursday afternoon.
