Badgers Class


We had a fabulous start to our topic, entitled 'Beast Creator', on Monday as we have also linked this to our book on the Amazon and being explorers. We have decorated our classroom to replicate a jungle feel, using the influence of artist Henri Rousseau, and started to create giant mini-beasts using modrock.

The children are learning how to make levers and sliders in design technology, so this week was a skill-based lesson on making sliders.
