

This week we have continued to have great fun in our role play of the flower shop. We have some budding florists and customer service assistants. We have been busy creating some beautiful art work using vegetables.

In Maths we were exploring the numbers 9 and 10, through stories, rhymes and games.

Squirrels Class - Years 1 & 2

We have been very busy this week, learning about what all animals need to survive in Science.

We have designed and created some lovely cards.

Y1s have begun to explore numbers up to 50 and Y2 have continued honing their multiplication and division skills with the 10 and 5 x tables.

We had a fabulous book scavenger hunt on World Book Day and enjoyed sharing stories with our friends.

Foxes Class - Years 3 & 4





We had great fun during 'World Book Day' describing the characters we had dressed as and a scene from the book or story. We used ambitious adjectives in our paragraphs. Children looked fabulous in their costumes which included The Grinch, The Runaway Pea, Cheshire Cat, Harry Potter, Baby Yoda, Where's Wally, butterfly, horse rider (complete with horse) and non-fiction book characters - quite a number of football players!

In maths, years 3 and 4 are developing their knowledge of fractions, including numerators and denominators, and comparing fractions. Year 4 enjoyed comparing mixed fractions and using their reasoning skills to explain answers to maths problems.

Badgers Class - Years 5 & 6

World Book Day was a delightful highlight as the children thoroughly enjoyed dressing up as their favourite book characters, immersing themselves in the joy of reading and storytelling. In our PE lessons at Witham Hall, we have observed excellent sportsmanship among the students. They have demonstrated teamwork, respect, and fair play.

Our exploration of light in science has continued. Through hands-on experiments and discussions, the children are developing a deeper understanding of the properties and behaviours of light. In English, the students are nearing the completion of their film review projects. They have been honing their analytical skills, creativity, and written expression as they craft thoughtful reviews of the film.



Wood School - Badgers Class

Due to World Book Day, we had a true Forest School session, this is where you have a prompt, but you let the children have child led play. This was an amazing session as majority of the children chose to build a new den, the engineering skills to stop it from falling were amazing. Everyone then helps carry the sticks up, the teamwork and problem solving. I was in owe watching them. Other children were inspired by this and started building their own den or climbed up the rope or played in our rope area.
