## **Wood School**



### **Squirrels Class – EYFS**

Continuing our magical tales' topic and the story of The Gingerbread Man, which we are thoroughly immersed in, we baked and decorated Gingerbread men with icing and eyes, just like in the story!

We have enjoyed outdoor learning and used a huge cardboard box to create our chosen object of an aeroplane for role play outside. Painting it together was so much fun! I wonder what journeys will it take us on?





### Squirrels Class - Years 1 & 2

In maths we are now recording in White Rose maths workbooks, which is supporting our understanding. Year 1 have been writing number sentences and using arrays to count in 2s, 5s. and 10s. In year 2 we have been learning about unit and non-unit fractions. We been learning about compass points to navigate north, south, east or west? We learnt that that compass points can describe a location or the direction of travel. We have been practising travelling in different directions outside.





## Foxes Class – Years 3 & 4

Foxes have worked superbly hard on their maths this week – year 3 are focusing on money and year 4 decimals and they should be proud of their hard work. In science, we have looked at the melting point of chocolate and the best way to melt it.

In wood school, we had fire making sessions for the last 2 weeks enjoying smores and campfire donuts. We also used tools for witling and Christine worked with children to split wood using larger tools.



## Badgers Class – Years 5 & 6

This week in Badgers class, we have been focusing on revising key skills.

In Maths, Year 6 students dedicated their time to revising for their upcoming SATs, while Year 5 students focussed on consolidating their understanding of decimals.

In English, the emphasis was on reinforcing grammar skills and integrating language techniques into our writing tasks.

Meanwhile, in History, the students delved into the intriguing world of Ancient Egypt, offering a fascinating insight into the past.

It has been a productive week in Badgers class, with students engaging wholeheartedly in their learning endeavours.
